Adjunct Faculty – Sport Management/Administration (online/on-campus)

Position Description:

An Adjunct Faculty member teaches on a periodic basis, dependent upon the needs of the institution for any given semester. MACU is currently looking for an adjunct professor who can teach in the area of sport management/administration beginning immediately.

SM 201 Introduction to Sport Management – This course provides information about the administration of athletic, fitness, and wellness facilities, and proper organizational, administrative, supervisory, and leadership procedures will be covered. Topics include, but are not limited to: sport industry segment, intercollegiate athletics, professional sport, fitness, recreation, budgeting, facility management, legal issues, record keeping, insurance, and technology in these settings.

SM 211 Sport Marketing – Examines the theoretical and practical implications of marketing in the sports industry by presenting a framework to help explain and organize the strategic marketing process. Offers a growing appreciation on the globalization of sports and an understanding of the ethical issues emerging in sports and their impact on sport marketing decisions.

SM 311 Sport Administration – Principles of efficient management and leadership concepts as applicable to the sport industry. Focuses on principles and techniques of management relating to programs, facilities, special events, and personnel. Includes key personnel issues in sport management situations; ethics, law, and governance in sport management; the role of the marketing process in sport administration; and economics, accounting, and budgeting.

SM 321 Sport Legal Liability & Risk Management - Study of the legal implications of tort, liability law, and risk management in sports related fields. Provides specific law terminology, issues, cases, and decisions that have been addressed by the American legal system. Presents an overview of the legal system, an introduction to conducting legal research, an explanation of the role of arbitration as an alternative to litigation, and an examination of the role of practical risk management programs in sport fields.

Degree Requirements:

Ideal: Doctorate degree in sport management, sport administration, or a related discipline, teaching and/or professional experience.

Minimum: Masters degree in sport management, sport administration, or related discipline, minimal teaching and/or professional experience.

Responsibilities:

The candidate must possess a mature Christian faith and be able to demonstrate teaching competence, scholarly ability and be knowledgeable in his or her discipline. The applicant must be respectful to the Stone-Campbell faith tradition, and in full agreement with the school's doctrinal statement. One must be able to contribute to the well being and advancement of an academic Christian community by integrating scholarship with the community's faith tradition. The candidate must be a person of virtuous character and lifestyle who is willing to invest himself or herself in the holistic development of his or her students. The candidate must be committed to both ministerial and discipleship training in a Christian university context.

Application Process:

Send (1) a letter of application, (2) a curriculum vitae, (3) unofficial copies of all graduate transcripts, (4) a list of four references (three professional and one spiritual) whom the university may contact, and (5) a statement of teaching philosophy that includes how the applicant has integrated or intends to integrate a Christian Theistic Worldview in the teaching-learning process.
