



Mid-Atlantic Christian University Announcement for Full-Time Faculty Position

Biology Professor (Rank Open)

Position Description:

This is a full-time faculty position, beginning January 1, 2025. Salary is commensurate with experience and degree held at the time of appointment. The faculty member will teach on average 24 undergraduate credit hours an academic year, which includes preparing syllabi, teaching, and evaluating instructional outcomes of assigned courses. The faculty member will serve as the faculty advisor for students in the biology program in the School of Undergraduate Studies. The faculty member will attend committee and faculty meetings, and maintain regular office hours. Full-time faculty are expected to pursue professional development appropriate to the field in which they are hired, in this case biological science; and be involved in church and community service opportunities.

MACU has built new science labs for a young biology program. The new labs were put into service in November 2023.

Qualifications:

Strong preference will be given to applicants who have an earned doctorate in a field of biological science. The candidate should be skilled and knowledgeable in modern techniques as they apply to the wide field of Biology. The candidate must be able to teach across the wide breadth of biological science related disciplines and demonstrate currency on issues and trends as they relate to the science. A specific area of research interest is open, but preference will be given to those whose scholarly activity is most likely to stimulate undergraduate research in Ecology, Botany, Zoology, Field Biology, or a related area. Prior teaching and leadership experience preferred as well.

Top preference will be given to applicants who are experientially and theologically committed to the Stone-Campbell faith tradition. All candidates must be in full agreement with the school's doctrinal statement.

Responsibilities:

The candidate must possess a mature Christian faith and be able to demonstrate teaching competence, scholarly ability and be knowledgeable in his/her discipline. One must be able to contribute to the well-being and advancement of an academic Christian community by integrating scholarship with the community's faith tradition. The candidate must be a person of virtuous character and lifestyle who is willing to invest him/herself in the holistic development of students. The candidate must be committed to both ministerial and discipleship training in a Christian college context.

Application Process:

Send (1) a letter of application, (2) a curriculum vitae, (3) unofficial copies of all transcripts, (4) a list of four references (three professional and one spiritual) whom the university may contact, and (5) a statement of teaching philosophy that includes how the applicant has integrated or intends to integrate a Christian Theistic Worldview in the teaching-learning process.
