Position Overview:

Reporting to the Athletic Director (AD), the primary purpose of the Head Coach of the women’s basketball program at Mid-Atlantic Christian University (MACU) is to develop relationships to further enhance the academic, social, and spiritual growth of students. This is accomplished by, but not limited to, coaching players on the court, mentoring players off the court, and recruiting players that share a desire for the mission of the university. The university is amenable to college coaches that need to finish out the current season.

Athletic Department Goals:

The four goals listed below are how we measure success within athletics at MACU. They are in order and are expected to be fulfilled by all head coaches:

1. Produce supportive graduates
2. Coach a team that spectators are proud to support
3. Meet or exceed roster requirement
4. Compete on the scoreboard

Compensation:

This is a part-time contract position that comes with a **\$9,000 stipend**. To supplement income, there are additional openings at the university and a need for teachers and other positions in the local public school system.
