Transitions

CHANGE, OR TRANSITION, is one of the most feared things that human beings encounter. We resist change. We love stability. We love for things to remain as they are. But one inevitable aspect of life is that it always changes. As someone has said, the only thing constant is change.

In the September 25 edition of the *Harvard Business Review*, Rosabeth Moss Kanter identified ten reasons why we resist change. She mentions *loss of control, uncertainty, change requires more work, concerns about competence, and loss of face* as issues keeping us from embracing change. Often we find that instead of embracing change and using it positively to transition us forward, we drag our feet, and even try to sabotage the efforts because we are comfortable with things the way they are – even if they are not working well.

In a recent article, Cary Nieuwhof, wrote: “Change is at the heart of leadership because a leader’s job is to take people from where they are to where they need to be. You can’t do that without ushering in change” (“7 Signs Your Church Will Never Change,” Cary Nieuwhof). Transition and growth require a vision that looks ahead, not backwards. When all of our excitement is about the past, we haven’t got much of a future.

Each year I visit multiple churches or talk with people in congregations looking for kingdom workers to preach, teach, or serve. At times the congregations are declining in attendance and offerings, making it difficult to pay a minister adequately. In nearly every instance the people with whom I am speaking think that the answer is in getting the right person to come in and move things forward. In discussions prior to hiring, church leaders proudly insist that they are

willing to pay the price to change and grow. But once the minister is on the field and assesses the situation and begins to recommend areas that need to change, he is immediately met with stiff opposition or passive-aggressive resistance. Often the congregation will move from one minister to the next, often continuing to decline and dim the light of the gospel in their community. And the “blame game” continues.

Mid-Atlantic Christian University completed her 71st year of Kingdom ministry in 2018-2019. There are some things about MACU that will never change. For example, our statement of faith, which must be signed annually by all staff and faculty members, is the same one employees and trustees signed in 1948. Another unchanging focus of MACU is our commitment to Biblical higher education. Founded as Roanoke Bible College, the central textbook and area of study was the Bible. The Bible remains the central textbook for students, and a Christian worldview is evident in every class and curriculum (Bible, business, biology, counseling, preaching, youth and family ministry, science education). We will never change our focus from building the kingdom of God through preparing workers for the vineyard and serving the church.

Our Leadership Team has been reviewing our strategic plan to ensure that we are focused on God and His mission for MACU. There are four elements of this vision that will determine if we are about our purpose.

First, is every student *experiencing Christ*? In the classroom, chapel, extra-curricular events, dorm life, are people experiencing Christ and growing in their relationship with Jesus? Our DNA is Biblical higher education and teaching the



scriptures as the inspired, authoritative, inerrant Word of God. We desire that our students and graduates build their lives and vocations on the solid foundation of Christ and his word.

Second, is every student receiving an *excellent education*? In today's environment, churches, corporations, educational institutions, etc. require proficient individuals to serve. I believe that the quality of education at MACU exceeds that of most educational institutions. Alumni who enter graduate programs report that they were well prepared for advanced studies. The average student in the United States graduates from college owing more than \$30,000 in student loans. We do students a disservice if we have not provided them excellence in education which prepares them to be successful in the work force.

Third, are our students *experiencing community*? The Mid-Atlantic community has been, and continues to be, a caring family. Students make long-lasting friendships, faculty and staff members pray with students, students pray with and support one another. From 1948 to 2019 students have found the MACU community to be a place of great spiritual and personal importance.

The final element of our vision that we can evaluate and see if we are about our purpose of transforming ordinary people into extraordinary Christian leaders is whether or not they are reaching out: are our students *engaging culture* with the gospel and truth of God's word? At MACU we are about building the church – and that means engaging the world in which we live and being the salt of the earth and the light of the world. We see alumni across the nation and world making

disciples, leading growing congregations, establishing new churches. Alumni engage people in various cultures and transformation of lives takes place in parachurch ministries and in cross-cultural engagement around the world.

It is impossible to get from where we are to where we are going without making a transition. I feel that a greater part of our success as a Christian, and as a Christ-centered university, is how we manage transition. We need to learn how to function and ultimately be successful in the season of transition.

The nature of transition is not a change just for the sake of change; a transition is moving from one point to another point. It is essentially moving forward. When we as Christians begin to encounter transition, when things begin to get shaky and unfamiliar, we need to realize that God is taking us somewhere. He is repositioning us. There are things you cannot accomplish where you are at this moment. God wants to strategically position you so that you will be able to access things that you could never see or reach in your current location.

As I serve MACU, I covet your prayers for wisdom – that God will clearly show the way and that we will embrace His direction.

Thank you for being an essential partner in this Kingdom mission!

Academic Affairs

EVERY INSTITUTION GOES through transitions. Churches go through them when ministerial staff changes. Families go through them when major life events occur such as weddings, births, job changes, and funerals. Colleges and universities go through them as personnel change or the needs of the church and society necessitate a change in curricular offerings. For the past three years the Department of Biblical Studies has been examining its course offerings. Their study identified two changes that need to be made so that students are better served to be Kingdom disciples. The reality is that many students come to MACU with little to no Bible knowledge. In an effort to ensure the strongest foundation, the Department of Biblical Studies will offer a new course, required of all students, that will give an overall survey of the Bible. The course will be called “The Story of Redemption.” The second change is a broader use of the Biblical Studies minor for non-vocational ministry students.

MACU had a robust graduating class this year. MACU graduated 13 students with degrees intentionally designed for the individual who wants to be involved in vocational ministry (preaching, youth ministry, missions). MACU graduated 12 students who majored in counseling and psychology. And the university graduated 5 students with majors in other areas, such as education or business administration. There were also some 2-year degree recipients in the class of 2019. The university anticipates its first graduates this next year in the area of biology.

MACU continues to be a provider of educational opportunities around the globe. In the spring 2019 MACU was asked to establish an educational opportunity for ministers in Rwanda. Rwandan ministers must have at least a 2-year degree to preach (new Rwandan law). MACU and the mission organization Rwanda Challenge, led by MACU alumnus Frank Reynolds, will be working on a strategy to help these men who want to be preachers earn their credentials to meet the new federal requirement in Rwanda. Closer to home, MACU created with Christ Covenant School in Winterville, NC a concurrent enrollment agreement so that high school students may earn high school and college credit simultaneously.

MACU continues to boast a solid faculty. Many faculty make presentations at conferences and conventions. Several faculty continue to contribute via writing and publication. Several faculty travel internationally to teach and support missionaries on the field.

As MACU reaches out to a broader audience, either at home through new programs like biopsychology (starting fall 2019) or through church leadership training in foreign lands, be assured that the foundation is strong. The Bible is at the core of what MACU is about. People are committed to the mission of training extraordinary Christian leaders for the church and the marketplace. 





Enrollment Services

MACU'S ENROLLMENT TEAM had a great year, recruiting 90 new freshmen for fall 2019, showing growth from 2018's 83 new students. One reason for this increase was meeting prospective students on the CACRAO (Carolinas Association of Collegiate Registrars & Admissions Officers) and VACRAO (Virginia Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers) circuits. These college fair circuits place college recruiters face-to-face with virtually every public school student in North Carolina and Virginia. Staffing this 10-week travel season and then processing the inquiries and applications required an all-hands-on deck effort.

Many of the public school students met expressed a desire to study the marketplace degrees MACU now offers: Biology, Business, Counseling and Psychology, and Elementary Education, opening a door for students who may not have otherwise enrolled. Not only have we increased new student enrollment, but we have also found some amazing young men and women. These new students are excited to part of a community of believers, play collegiate sports in a Christian environment, and enjoy our waterfront campus.

Another reason for our enrollment growth is athletics. The recent addition of men's baseball has been a nice boost for enrollment. We also refined our on-campus events and worked on our relationships with youth leaders and Christian schools.

We dedicated more recruiting resources to homeschool conventions and Christian youth conventions such as CCYC (Carolina Christian Youth Conference).

We are hoping to get face-to-face with even more youth leaders, Christian school counselors, and students seeking ministry degrees this upcoming year. To help do this, we hired two admissions counselors, Chip Mabe '17 and Dustin Mullins. Chip and Dustin made an immediate impact networking and setting up presentations and visits with churches and Christian schools. Brittany Meinsen '14 was promoted from admissions counselor to Enrollment Manager. She leads our team, which consists of Garrett "Pop" Lewis and Chip Mabe.

Enrollment numbers are trending upward. We recruited 66 new students in 2017, 83 new students in 2018, and 90 new students in 2019. The goal for 2020 is 100. While numbers are important, even critical, what I love about our enrollment team is that we truly believe the Lord places each student in our path for a reason. We know that when they arrive on campus they will Experience Christ. Once they step foot in a MACU classroom they will receive an Exceptional Education. And, just as students before them have done, they will Encounter Community both on and off campus. Please continue to pray that God brings quality people to MACU to be transformed into extraordinary Christian leaders.

We say YES to where God leads because **YOU SAID YES** to walking with us when it mattered most! God is working in us and through us at Mid-Atlantic Christian University, and we are confident that His Word is enough to change the world! 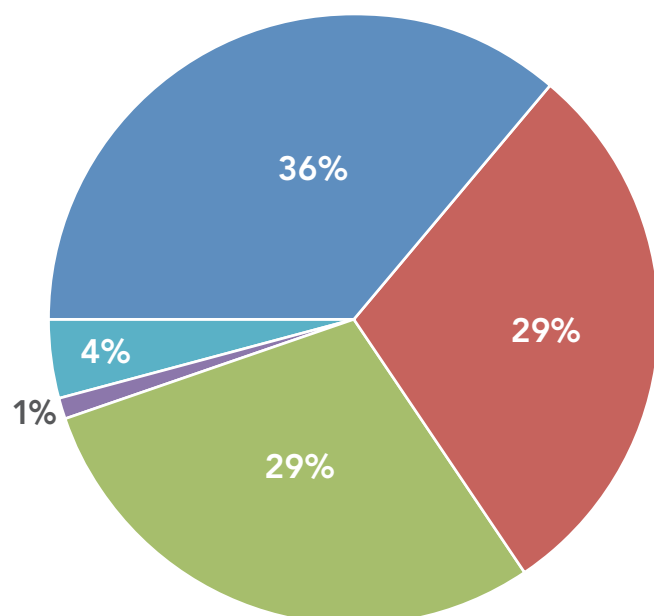

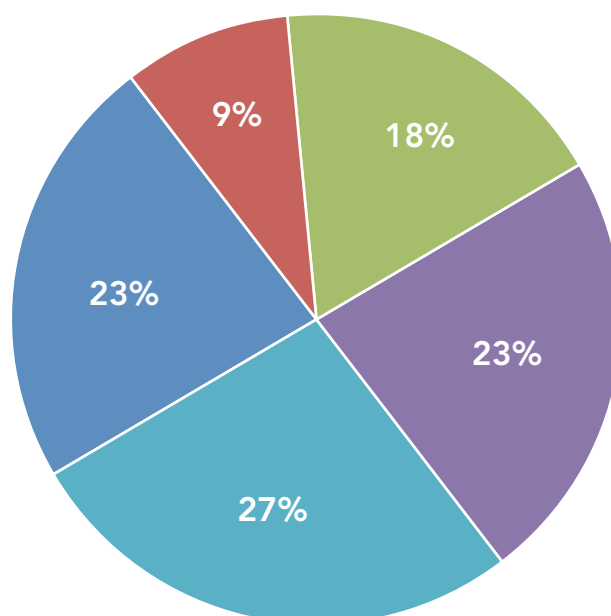
FY 2018-19 Revenues
