



The Class of 2007 decided to make a gift to help RBC meet its current financial need, presenting over \$4,000 to the college at graduation. They also left behind a symbolic and enduring gift of "Ebenezer." This is a rugged nine-foot granite monolith located on the northeast corner of campus where Knobbs Creek joins the Pasquotank River.

It is inscribed in Paleo-Hebrew with Samuel's words from 1 Samuel 7:12 for "stone of help" or "Ebenezer." This event is recalled in the second stanza of the traditional American hymn "Come Thou Fount."

Samuel's stone celebrated a providential victory in the Israelites' struggle to gain independence from Philistine oppression. This stone calls Roanoke Bible College and her students to remember that God will continue to be the source of strength and victory, just as He has been in the past.

Class of 2007 leaves lasting gift

n May 5, Roanoke sent forth 48 graduates, the largest graduating class in the college's 59-year history, raising the total of graduates to 1,077. Encouraging the graduates at baccalaureate was **Mike Wise**, manager of Roanoke Christian Service Camp in Washington, NC, and at commencement, **Eddie Lowen '86**, senior minister at West Side Christian Church in Springfield, IL. Class speakers were covaledictorians **Nicole G. Jones** and **Glen D. Layfield**, each with a perfect 4.0 average, and salutatorian **Robert B. Spruill**, with a 3.953 average.

Honors and recognitions bestowed that day included those named to Delta Epsilon Chi Honor Society: 2007 graduates Nicole G. Jones and John W. Scott and alumni Registrar Joan U. Sawyer '69 and Assistant Vice President for Finance Carol M. Stuart '89.







A major accomplishment in the academic division during her second term was the development and implementation of the Service-Learning program as the college's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP). A QEP is required by one of our accrediting agencies (SACS), and has proven a blessing to both the college and the community at large. She will continue as QEP director.

She also looks forward to directing the fiftieth year of The Master's Twelve, a group she formed as an RBC student.

While her first retirement from administrative duties was heralded with a banquet in 2001, she asked to quietly transition to her new role this year. Professors' achievements, community involvement



Dr. Lee Fields has been selected to work with the CoHeLeT (Communicative Hebrew Learning and Teaching) Project. This project, headed by Dr. Paul Overland

of Ashland Theological Seminary (ATS in Ashland, OH) and funded by the Wabash Center for Teaching and Learning in Theology and Religion in Wabash, IN, aims to apply lessons learned from second language acquisition to teaching biblical Hebrew. Fields is one of six professors involved in the second tier of the project. This second of three stages is field testing and evaluating communicative materials that have been designed by the first tier of researchers. His duties this year will involve attending a training workshop at ATS, June 12-14, implementing those into his Biblical Hebrew course for 2007-2008, and evaluation. Another workshop will be held June 9-13, 2008, to determine results and begin publishing findings. Dr. Fields was also named Roanoke's Teacher of the Year.

President Perkins, along with his wife, Sandra, traveled to France in May for him to make a presentation at the European Academy of Management (EURAM) Annual Conference. Dr. Perkins, with Dr. Dail Fields of Regent University, presented a paper entitled "Exploring the Relationship of Top Management Team Diversification with Organizational Performance of Christian Churches," which they co-wrote. In addition to his administrative duties, Dr. Perkins teaches leadership courses at RBC. EURAM is a professional society for scholars in the field of management. While in France, the Perkinses also visited Karen Richardson '87, a missionary in Poitiers, and Justin and Jen Powell, missionaries in Paris. Justin is the son of George '77 and Ann '74 Powell.

Some of **Prof. Don McKinney's** counseling students volunteered counseling services at Perquimans Juvenile Detention Center. Students of **Prof. Sam Loveall** (Advisor, Worship and Music Ministry Minor) provided music two times each month at a local elementary school's after-school program. 

he year 2006/2007 has been a memorable one for RBC. We are pleased to announce the selection of Dr. Kevin Larsen as our third Vice President for Academic Affairs. Please join us for this important service on Wednesday, August 22, 2007, at 7:30 p.m., Investiture and Convocation.

As in all years, there have been victories and disappointments. Victory–we welcomed Professor Ken Greene in youth ministry and Adjunct Professor Ivy Brothers in Deaf Studies. Disappointment–we discovered that RBC has been operating in a deficit. Victory– those who love RBC have responded with over \$245,000 over and above regular giving. Disappointment–we still need to raise \$755,000 or we will need to borrow funds to operate. Victory–RBC will open an offsite campus at First Christian Church Ministries in Kernersville, NC. Disappointment–the staff and faculty lost both the alumni basketball game and the softball game at River Day. Victory–RBC is offering more and more on-line classes. Victory–RBC offers a co-op nursing program in conjunction with the College of The Albemarle. Victory–Preaching is now a major, not just a minor.

There is so much more. But know this: RBC has been set for the defense of the Gospel since 1948 and now she stands ready to continue the tradition of educating extraordinary leaders. The future certainly holds challenges, but the future is just as certainly very bright for RBC.

Three blue ribbon task forces are studying the challenges before us: increasing student enrollment, reducing costs to students, and a possible name change for RBC.

Next year RBC will celebrate 60 years. Rumor is there will be fireworks.

At graduation we started a new tradition. Each graduate received a spike and a towel and was encouraged to place them where they would be seen often. The spike is a reminder of the price that has been paid for his salvation. The towel is a reminder to be a servant leader.

We graduated 48 extraordinary leaders for the Kingdom–our largest graduating class in our 59-year history. Four of these began their college education at Lincoln Christian College– East Coast. The vast majority are headed for full-time ministry.

Kevin Larsen appointed new Vice President for Academic Affairs



On July 1, Kevin W. Larsen, Ph. D., will become RBC's next Vice President for Academic Affairs. Dr. Larsen joined the Roanoke faculty in 2005 when Lincoln Christian College–

East Coast closed (previously known as Eastern Christian College); he had taught there since 1994. Dr. Larsen's education includes a Ph.D. (Biblical Studies, The Catholic University of America, 2002); graduate work (Westminster Theological Seminary); M.A., M.Div. (Cincinnati Christian University, 1994); and B.A. (Nebraska Christian College, 1991). He teaches courses in Greek, Bible, and Bible-related subjects.

Dr. Larsen has also taught classes

for Regent University and Appari Bible Seminary (Philippines). He was ordained to ministry in 1992 and has held ministries in four states. Mission trips have taken him to eight countries, and at press time he was in Prague with a group of RBC students, faculty, and staff members.

As RBC's Director of Institutional Research and Effectiveness, he has been instrumental in various curricular and accrediting association advances and projects. He is published in various journals and, since 2005, has been a consulting editor for the *Stone-Campbell Journal*.

A Life Nell Lived - Lucille Dunbar Griffin November 10, 1912 - February 18, 2007

The following are excerpts from former President William Griffin's tribute to his mother, "Grandma Lucy," which he spoke at her memorial service in the college chapel on Feb. 21.

Mother was born on November 10, 1912, to Hertford and Julie Dunbar and grew up in Scranton, NC. Her father was from a great line of loggers. Her mother was the religious leader in the family. She passed a lot of that on down to her daughter. I have often said that I was somewhat like Timothy . . . Timothy's faith "dwelt first in [his] grandmother Lois and then [his] mother Eunice."

On April 10, 1935, she eloped with John Griffin, her almost next door neighbor. I was born in 1939. Lucille became very active in the church, but John was not. Mother continued in her relationship with the Lord and church and had me there all the time.

Things changed in our lives in 1947 when my dad was baptized and soon became a leader in the Scranton Christian Church. Our home became a haven for preachers, primarily those who were preaching at Scranton and thus coming for the weekend or coming for revivals. It was also a stopover place for preachers going to other churches in the area. In 1954, Mother became a dorm mother at Camp Roanoke. This began her love affair with RBC. From then on, there was hardly ever a choral program or anything the college did that they were not in attendance.

My mother and dad were inseparable—they did everything together. My dad began a logging business of his own in the

late 60s. One of my memories is of Mother's driving the log truck to take a load of logs to the saw mill. The patrolman stopped her and she did not have special truck driver's license—she argued that she owned the truck—but Dad's name was on the registration card. So the patrolman took Mother home, leaving the truck along the road.

It was this same truck that Dad drove to the mill in Pantego in 1971 and when he took the chains off the logs, they rolled off on him. That was a tragic day in Mother's life for their lives had been so intertwined for almost fifty years.

But Mother was a fighter—she moved to Elizabeth City in 1972. I was managing the college bookstore at the time and Mother became the assistant manager, which she continued when Ed [Griffin] became the bookstore manager. She eventually retired, but soon began volunteering in the cafeteria—because it was so important to be present to be the "grandmother" for all the college kids. That's the way she always introduced herself during orientation.

To the Griffins and the host of Grandma Lucy's extended family, friends, and RBC "kids," we extend heartfelt sympathy. Her legacy of faith will live on in them and in those who will benefit from the John and Lucille Griffin Fund in the RBC Foundation.
