Just one, please.

That is one of my prayers as I travel from church to church. "Lord, will you allow me to talk to just one person that would have a desire to attend Mid-Atlantic, especially to study preaching. Just one, please. Amen."

We all love compliments. One that has stuck in my memory I received just prior to coming to the leadership team at Mid-Atlantic some four years ago. A fellow preacher told me, "Clay, I am glad you are going to guide one of our colleges because you love ministry." He was right. After three decades in ministry, I can say without reservation: "I love ministry."

But here is a reality: Fewer and fewer people are interested in vocational ministry. If ever the words of Jesus were true - and they always are - they are especially true for this generation. "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field" (Matthew 9:37). I am sure that both presidents BonDurant and Griffin felt the same pressure that I am now feeling. We need more workers for the harvest, and we need them now!

The need is great. Currently there are 44 openings for ministry on the Mid-Atlantic website. Recently I was privileged to preach at the Metro Christian Convention in Metropolitan New York City. Over 8 million people live there, more than in 40 individual states, yet we have less than 30 Restoration churches. Every month 1,500 ministers leave the ministry. Of the 6,500 world languages there are 4,400 with NO portion of the Scripture. Every minute 62 people around the world die without Christ.

It is easy to become overwhelmed when the need is so great, but one has to remind himself that little is much in the hands of God. Remember that just one boy's lunch fed the multitudes. Remember that twelve men changed the course of history forever. In the history of Eastern and Roanoke it is amazing the difference one graduate has made. Consider the work of Dr. Ajai Lall with Central India Christian Mission - 700+ churches, orphanages, clinics, a printing ministry, and more. The work of George Powell in Oregon with a multi-campus congregation. The 30-year work of Frank Reynolds in New Hampshire. The long and fruitful ministry of Jimmy Bennett in Virginia. The growth and outreach of Ray West's work in North Carolina . . . the list could go on and on. Just one can make such a huge difference.

We all need to be intentionally challenging men and women to consider vocational ministry.

From the Office of the President

In the Christian Churches/Churches of Christ there are many reasons for encouragement. Many groups are taking bold steps to reverse the trend of fewer men interested in ministry. If we do not reverse the trend now, the future of our movement could be in significant jeopardy with the lack of preachers/ministers. Christian camps are seeking to partner with our colleges to send more students. CIY has placed a major emphasis on Kingdom workers, hoping to send significant numbers to our colleges to study for ministry. Restoration Revolution, out of the National Missionary Convention, is seeking to identify, equip, and deploy 10,000 new missionaries, preachers, and full-time Christian leaders. Church planting organizations are boldly moving forward. Our colleges in the Restoration Movement are seeking to cooperate in a new way to encourage our churches to renew the call for young and young at heart to consider ministry! The spirit of God is moving in a mighty way.

We all need to be intentionally challenging men and women to consider vocational ministry. By the year 2020, Mid-Atlantic desires to have 10 different ministerial degrees to educate those who will work in vocational ministry. Did you know that 80% of the male graduates from Mid-Atlantic are in vocational ministry? We educate ministers! There are 246 churches that support Mid-Atlantic. What if each church sent one student every year, especially to study preaching? We would begin to fill the gap needed for ministers. There are nearly 6,000 families receiving this publication. What if every family would encourage one person to study at Mid-Atlantic and to consider vocational ministry? God's Kingdom would advance in a mighty way.

So, will you join me in this prayer: "Lord, will you allow me to talk to just one person each year who would have a desire to attend Mid-Atlantic, especially to study preaching. Just one, please. Amen." It would be great to see all of our colleges overwhelmed with students passionate about being a Kingdom worker. God longs to see heaven full with the many these workers will introduce to His Kingdom.

President Griffin Named to Order of the Long Leaf Pine

Mid-Atlantic again had the opportunity to be instrumental in seeing that another one of her own was recognized for a life of service, to give honor where honor is due. As the scripture says: "... if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor" (Romans 13:7).

The Office of the President at Mid-Atlantic Christian University, in conjunction with the Office of the Governor of the State of North Carolina under Governor Beverly Perdue's leadership, is pleased to announce that her second



president, William A. Griffin (1986-2006), was presented the highest civilian honor awarded by the State of North Carolina, The Order of the Long Leaf Pine.

Representative Bill Owens (NC House, District 1), who grew up across the street from the college, presented the award at the opening service of the Gospel Rally, Mar. 18.

The Order of the Long Leaf Pine is awarded to citizens who have performed public service in the State for a minimum of 30 years. President Griffin was cited for his 47 years of service -20 of them as president - with a North Carolina university that has educated more than 3,200 students (who now serve in 45 states and 13 countries). He has also written two historical books, Antebellum Elizabeth City and Roanoke Bible College: The First 25 Years.

Class of 2010 Challenged to Show Extreme Love

In a world marked by acts of extremism, commencement speaker Dr. Ajai Lall '83 challenged members of the Class of 2010 on May 8 to be Christian extremists – making the world a better place and expanding the borders of the Kingdom by extending to others extreme love, compassion, and service. Dr. Lall and his wife, Dr. Indu Lall, lead Central India Christian Mission, a work they established in 1983 that has touched many thousands of their countrymen.

Twenty graduates comprise the Class of 2010 (including the five whose degrees were conferred in August and January), raising the total of graduates to 1,143. Encouraging the graduates at baccalaureate May 7 was Neal O. Alligood, a 1998 graduate of MACU. Neal is an associate minister at Christ's Church at Cobb in the Greater Atlanta, GA, area. He has previously been on staff at MACU, a youth minister, and a campus minister.

Class speakers were Valedictorian Crystal N. Conner and Salutatorian Charles E. "Charlie" Stephenson. Dr. Ajai Lall, representing Central India Biblical Academy (CIBA), and Dr. Clay Perkins of Mid-Atlantic signed an agreement at graduation declaring the two "sister schools." The boards of both Mid-Atlantic Christian University and Central India Christian Mission voted unanimously to begin this sister school relationship. As sister schools, both schools will benefit from a continual exchange of students, professors, and other personnel. Leaders from each mission will continue to collaborate on further aspects of this sister school relationship.

This agreement is the first step in fulfilling one part of Mid-Atlantic's vision to be a growing community of superior biblical higher education. Recently the Board of Trustees approved a Vision 2020 document. Vision is a preferred future. In Mid-Atlantic Christian University's future, we prefer one of our realities to be having three sister school relationships with other Christian universities/Bible colleges around the globe. 

Pruett Honored for Life of Service Dennis D. Pruett, M.D., awarded Doctor of Divinity



From battlefield to classroom to operating room to mission point to boardroom - all of these are places Dennis D. Pruett, M.D., has made his mark on the world. On May 8 Mid-Atlantic honored his years of service by awarding him the degree Doctor of Divinity, honoris causa.

Born in West Virginia in 1924, Pruett enlisted in the U.S. Naval Air Corps after high school graduation and fought in World War II, earning a Purple Heart, the Air Medal with four stars, and the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Following WWII he attended Kentucky Christian University and married Lucille Garten. After graduation he began medical school at Bowman Gray School of Medicine at Wake Forest University. During that time he helped establish and preached for two churches in Winston-Salem. He and Lucy had four children and all pursued careers in medicine or Christian missions, or both.

In 1956, "Doc" and Lucy, along with John and Marge Pemberton, established Central African Mission in Zimbabwe, originally named Mashoko Christian Mission. The mission became home for more than 70 missionary families and included physicians, dentists, nurses, preachers, educators, builders, and other support personnel.

Dr. Pruett established the Fellowship of Associates of Medical Evangelism (FAME) in 1970 and served as president until 1985. Also in 1970, he established Zimbabwe Christian College. In 1985, he began HASTEN (Health and Salvation to Every Nation) International, which supports missionaries in six countries.

Following Lucy's death in 1988, Dr. Pruett met and married Dr. Jean Craig. They continue to work tirelessly visiting churches and missions, and administering the work of the Lord through HASTEN. She holds a doctorate in Health Science and assists Dr. Pruett at Old Town Immediate and Family Care, a clinic they established. It has received the highest award given to immediate care facilities in Winston-Salem, NC.

managers, missionaries, and more. We were awarded the Presidential Honor Roll for community service for the third time. One highlight of our community service this past year was our food packaging service project on Martin Luther King Day. We packaged over 61,000 meals that were shipped to earthquake stricken Haiti. We had an accreditation review visit from the Association of Biblical Higher Education (ABHE), one of our accrediting bodies. The hard work paid off, however, in February when our accreditation was extended another 10 years! Even in the midst of our financial difficulties, which ABHE noted, the association was satisfied with the steps we were taking and the course we were charting for the future.

Our major financial issues this year stem from the loss of our housing contract with Elizabeth City State University. For two years we had been renting unused dorm space to ECSU. We had a signed contract for this year as well. However, our Governor rescinded many state contracts last summer and put them up for rebid. A local hotel that was about to go out of business received the contract. This lost contract left us with a \$350,000 shortfall in our budget. We have been making cuts; however, we will still be almost \$200,000 short of where we need to be at the end of our fiscal year, June 30.

To make things worse, the Department of Education has determined that we will not receive student funds (grants, etc.) until September. We have previously been able to draw those funds in August to help cover the financially lean summer months. This ruling has left us with a serious cash flow crunch.

Even though our long term prognosis looks promising, our short term liquidity issues are critical. We continue to tighten our belts, but honestly, WE NEED YOUR HELP! First of all, would you pray for our current situation? We know God has the resources to take care of this need. Pray that God would lead us to those resources. Second, would you consider being an answer to that prayer? Could you make a special one-time gift, above and beyond your regular giving, to this need? Perhaps you might also challenge your churches, family, and friends to make a special gift as well. We will need some \$50 gifts, some \$500 gifts, some \$5,000 aifts, and many in between. MACU Named to President's Service Honor Roll Again

Mid-Atlantic has been named to the 2009 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for the third time. Renee Lease, Director of Service-learning, stated, "This award is for our overall emphasis on service. I included in the application all aspects of what we do - service-learning courses that get students into non-profit community organizations and churches, Alternative Spring Break sponsored by DARTS [working with Habitat for Humanity in Florida], and the MLK Campus Wide community service day."

Over 700 schools were listed on the Honor Roll for their community service activities during the 2008-2009 academic year, including 40 in North Carolina.


