Class of 2008 Challenged to Be Faithful



On May 10, Roanoke graduated 26, raising the total of graduates to 1,098. Encouraging the graduates at baccalaureate May 9 was **Andrew Peterson**, singer, songwriter, and author; and at commencement the next day, **Bob Russell**, the retired senior minister of Southeast Christian Church, Louisville, KY, who continues ministering through Bob Russell Ministries. Class speakers were Valedictorian **Howard A. Guidry**, with a 3.979 average, and Salutatorian **Corey R. Jones**, with a 3.884 average.

Honors and recognitions bestowed that day included those named to Delta Epsilon Chi Honor Society: 2008 graduate **Howard Guidry** and alumna **Barbara S. Griffin '64**.

Honored for 45 years of service each were **Professor S. Elizabeth BonDurant** and **Assistant to the President William A. Griffin**.

Professor BonDurant (*right*) served 32 years as Vice President for Academic Affairs. She now devotes full time to teaching music



classes. This year she organized and directed several performances for the 50th anniversary reunion choir of The Master's Twelve, an ensemble she began while a freshman at Roanoke. On May 7, she was recognized in an awards ceremony



for area teachers as Roanoke's Teacher of the Year. Mr. Griffin (*left*) served 20 of his 45 years as the college president, retiring in 2006. This year he retired from teaching and continues as Assistant to the President, working with alumni. His many duties in the past include bookstore manager, bursar, Dean of Students and full-time professor.

Students, Staff to the Gulf Coast Again

A team of 27 students, faculty, alumni, and friends spent spring break working with IDES/DART in Louisiana and Mississippi. This was RBC's third relief/rebuild trip to the Gulf Coast to help people whose lives were devastated by Hurricane Katrina. The first-timers on the trip were shocked to see just how much is still to be done in that area. Several were saddened by the fact that, for the most part, the area has been forgotten by the media and the country.

The RBC team worked on five new houses under construction in Pearlington, MS, performing such tasks as dry wall finishing, painting, trim, insulation, carpentry, pouring concrete, plumbing, and debris removal. On a trip to New Orleans, the students' hearts were touched when they saw hundreds living in a "tent city" under Interstate 10. That night they collected over \$350 that was used to buy supplies for the homeless. The supplies were delivered to the "tent city" the next morning.

Griffin, in 2006.

Reese Joins Faculty

Dr. Robert Reese will be joining the faculty at Roanoke for the 2008-2009 school year as Associate Professor of Cross-Cultural Ministry.



Dr. Reese is a third generation missionary and will bring to the classroom 21 years of full-time missionary experience in Zimbabwe. Dr. Reese is a graduate of Harding Uni-

versity (BS in Mathematics), Northwestern University (MS in Mathematics), Fuller Theological Seminary (MA in Missiology), and Mid-America Baptist Theology Seminary (PhD in Missions).

Since 2005 Dr. Reese has been the director of the World Mission Resource Center in Lancaster, PA. During this time he has led teaching seminars in Lebanon, Argentina, Colombia, South Africa, and Sri Lanka. Dr. Reese has presented papers at the Evangelical Missiological Society and is a regular presenter at the National Missionary Convention.

He and his wife (Mari-Etta) plan to move to Elizabeth City in mid-July.

Each year in chapel we have a "Preaching Rally" for those in the Preaching Major at Roanoke Bible College. I wish you could have been on campus with me to hear the future of preaching.

You would have heard Lyle Hinsdale, who came to us via the US Navy. He is currently serving as a preaching intern at Avalon Church of Christ in Virginia. Or maybe you would have heard Kurt Juergens, who is also a very good jazz musician, but he has a passion for preaching. He came to RBC from Lincoln Christian College-East Coast (LCC-EC).

Then there is Charlie Stephenson, whose family has a rich history in church planting, preaching, and missionary work. Charlie has worked on the mission field in the Philippines.
